<u>The Church of St Michael and All Angels</u>, was designed and built by Henry Woodyer in 1854-5 and is Grade II listed. It was designed and built as a collegiate chapel — the chapel of the former choral music college adjacent to it, and linked by cloisters.

The whole institution was founded in 1856 by Sir Frederick Arthur Ouseley, composer, organist, musicologist and priest (1825-1889) to preserve and enrich the tradition of Anglican church music. The school was founded in reaction to the decline of Anglican church music in the Victorian period. Ouseley sited it in a remote location so as to insulate it from the influence of London. The chapel now functions as a parish church. All the windows were designed by the Hardman firm, between 1856 and 1888, so there is a magnificent display of mid- to later Victorian stained glass here.

**St Mary's Church, Burford**, is located near to Burford House in Shropshire, about 0.7 miles (1 km) to the west of Tenbury Wells. The church is recorded in the National Heritage List for England as a designated Grade I listed building

The oldest surviving part of the church is in the chancel, and dates from the 12th century, with the nave and tower from the 14th century. In 1889–90 the church was extensively restored by Aston Webb for the Honourable Georgina Rushout of Burford House. He largely rebuilt the tower, added buttresses and crenellation to the nave and chancel, and replaced the tracery in the windows. Inside the church he rebuilt the chancel arch and roof
